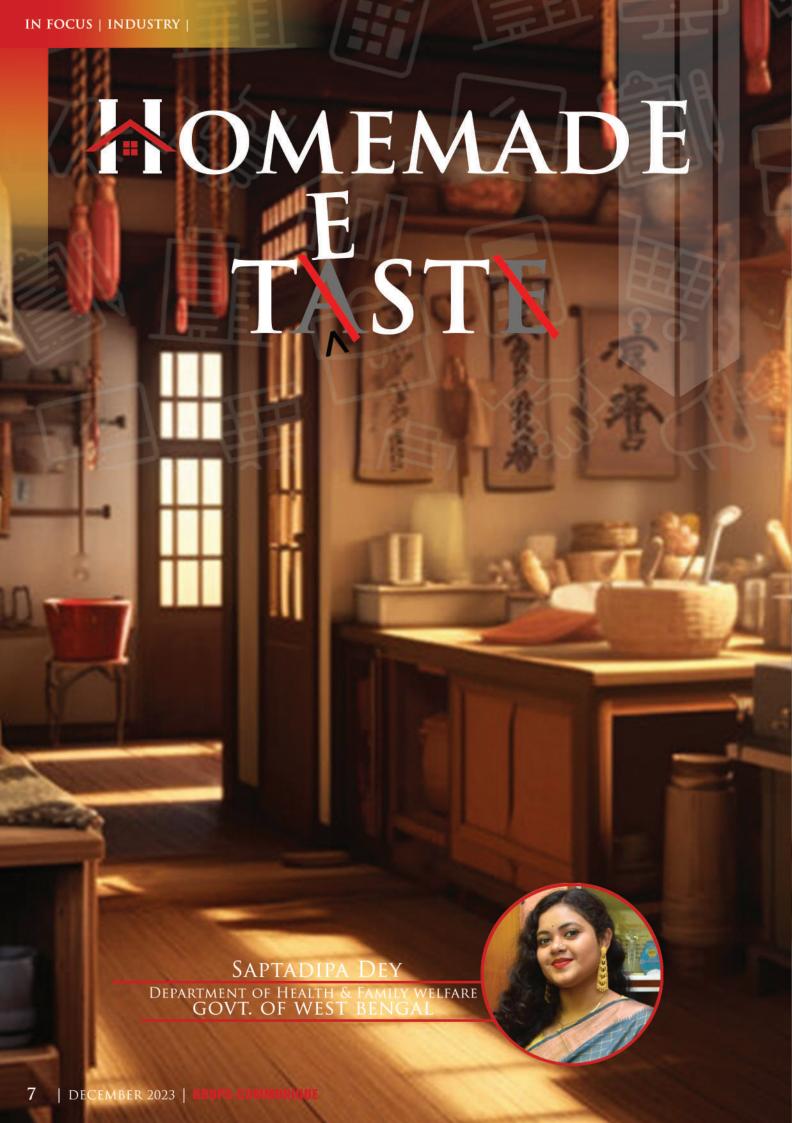












#### HEALTH HAS NEVER BEEN AN OPTION. IT'S AN OBLIGATION.

#### ello Dear Readers!

Hope you all are doing fine, HEALTH wise at the minimum. Legend says, "Food Safety is a responsibility to share"; so here I am, sharing my knowledge as a responsible Front Line Worker so that you all can save the knowledge, share the same and subscribe to the responsibility. Food Safety & Standards Authority of India, popularly known as FSSAI has already published books, Pink books, Orange books and many more. These are for all the commoners who think they are very busy to flip through the pages of these books but actually are not. Because health has never been an option, it's an obligation. Nobody knows what their body is going through internally, frequent heart attacks, cardiac arrests are very common these days, and the immediate blame goes to Junk Food. It is not the junk food always; sometimes the adulterated foods under the garb of healthy looking fruits, veggies, and condiments, dairy can pose severe health threat. Let us take a few examples to learn about the importance of homemade foods and homemade test kits to check the food we are eating.

#### Example 1:

You are a mother. Your child loves that curry you prepare with coconut oil. Well, the shopkeeper says it's genuine, but mothers can never be sure, they are extra cautious and always seek the best for their family. So, you take a small glass vessel, pour a moderate amount of oil in it and freeze it for 30mins. If the oil solidifies entirely, so should your trust in the shopkeeper. And if it shows a layer of mineral oil floating on top of a solid layer, it's time to change the oil.

#### Example 2:

I am a Bengali, and in winters I can only accept "Koraishutir Kochuri" (Fried bread made with a filling of mashed Green Peas" for breakfast and the core ingredient of the filing in green peas. What if the green in peas is not natural but loads of artificial colour? Well, take little amount of green peas in a transparent glass, add water to it and mix well, let it stand for half an hour. A clear separation of colour in water indicates adulteration. Now that you have healthy fried bread, go for a good potato curry to go with it. Add some hing (asafetida) as it is a natural flavor enhancer and helps a lot in digestion and works wonders for gut. Instead, some people feel uneasy upon consumption of hing, why? The answer is "Adulteration". Shake a little amount of Hing with water, if shaking gives clear solution, it is good for use, and if some soap stones and earthy matters settle at bottom, you should not settle down for this inferior hing quality.

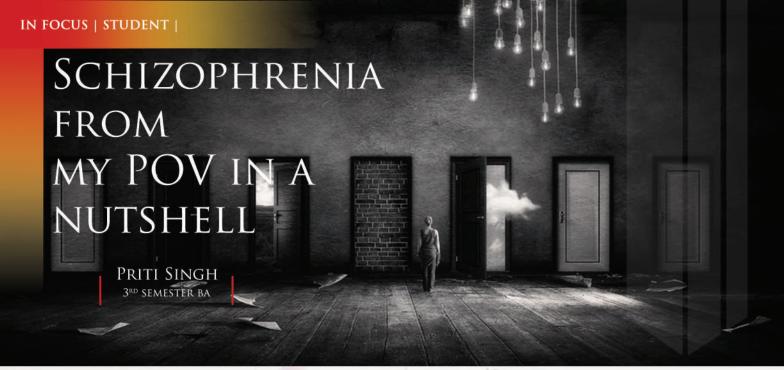
#### Example 3:

Imagine after a long tiring day at work, you come back home and sit down with a piping hot cup of tea. The tea tastes horrible. It would definitely not add colours to your day because all the colours are in the tea leaves. Take a small amount of tea leaves on a piece of paper, add water droplets slowly. If the leaves release streaks of colour on paper, the tea leaves are adulterated with artificial color. Now, Coffee drinkers might feel happy about it but they are about to be CLAYED. If mixing a spoon of coffee powder with water results into clay particles at bottom, the coffee is not of good quality. And if the coffee doesn't float on top of water, you are just paying exorbitant amount for chicory powder under the name of coffee.

#### Example 4:

So one day you open the fridge door, take a milk carton and find it empty. You can take a spoon of detergent and mix it in water, because that's what we have been doing with adulterated milk. Take a glass of milk, heat it with constant stirring. If this forms a dense lather, you are consuming detergent. A good glass of milk should give a very thin layer of foam, so do not fall for the TV commercials which show dense foam of milk to be original.

e feel this way because this is how it has been depicted in media. However, there might be some extreme cases that may appear to be slightly scary. People with schizophrenia tend to have strong beliefs about things that may not actually be true or possible. For example, they could possibly have a belief that others can read their minds. They may also withdraw themselves from social activities and isolate themselves. They may lack motivation and find it difficult to do tasks that normally don't require much effort.

It's not that such people are creeps. Just because the media shows us to be that way does not mean that we actually are like that. We may not look different to the rest of the population. This is because we slowly but surely learn to manage ourselves. We may not look any different while we hallucinate or feel detached from reality. In fact, we may look just as normal as any other human being. I, personally, have learnt to deal with my symptoms. I am getting better at it by the day.

People may not know that I deal with schizophrenia unless and until I either have a full-blown psychotic episode in front of them or tell them myself. I do not in any sense mean to say that it is an easy illness to deal with. It is, in fact, one of the most difficult and severe mental disorders. I just mean to say that it may get easier for the person dealing with it just like other things. This, however, is not true in all cases. This illness is the reason behind most suicide cases. It is very difficult to live life as if it's a nightmare.

I see faceless eyes and hear voices giving me orders or commanding me. They comment on what I do and even on how I walk. I am one of those few lucky people to have been receiving treatment which helps me convince myself to an extent that what I see, hear or feel the touch of, is not necessarily real. But many people don't have this privilege of receiving treatment. Even with treatment, some find it tremendously difficult to deal with.

In conclusion, schizophrenia is quite a severe illness and is not at all easy to deal with. This does not mean that we are crazy or creepy. It simply means that we are different. What would the world be if everyone were alike? We do need variations, which is why this illness exists, among other reasons. Just because symptoms are not visible does not mean they are not real. So stop judging. If any of your loved ones is suffering from this illness, I suggest you check on them regularly because I'm pretty sure they won't open up as they believe they're a burden to you.

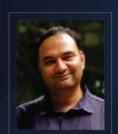

## THE LOST HEROES

oday, we are debating whether or not to stand up for the National anthem and National flag. But are you aware that most have sacrificed their lives protecting the National flag?

The national flag, it's a nation's flag which is more than just a piece of cloth. It is the most solemn, officially recognized by a nation's constitution or customs. The flag stands for the entire nation, its values, ambitions, aspirations, and sense of pride. Since the national flag is the most powerful emblem of patriotism, people have gone up their lives for it throughout the history of mankind to protect it.

There was a man who gave up his life protecting the national flag. "Kumaraswamy Mudaliar" was born in 1904 in a handloom weaving family in Tamilnadu and was actively participating in the freedom movement. Even though Tirupur Kumaran lived only for 27 years the way he died etched his name in the history.

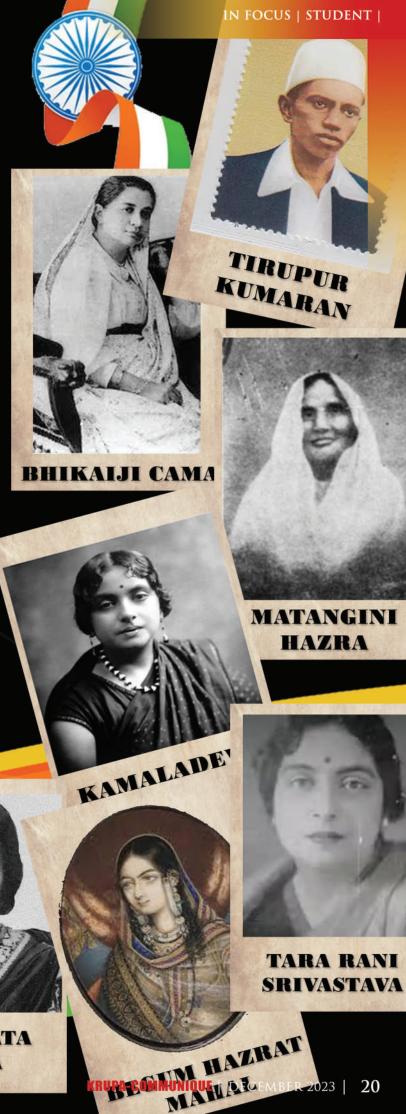
Kumaran had to drop out of school when he was in class 5. His family was unable to pay for his education, so he was forced to enter the family business to help out financially. Motivated by the ideas and beliefs of Gandhi, Kumaran started taking part in the protest that Gandhi had announced. He was one of the young participating revolutionaries. His family was very concerned about him, but he paid no attention to their advice. He was so involved that he founded 'Desha Bandhu Youth Association' to fight for Indian independence. He organized a countless number of protest. But one unfortunate day what his family feared for a long time came true.



On January 11, 1932, a patriotic march was organized and the people carried the Indian national flag which was banned at that time. The British started a lathicharge but Kumaran had refused to leave the premises. All the protestors were thrashed and Kumaran got caught in the beatings. The flag stayed off the ground when the young man collapsed. He was later found on the street, still clutching the Indian flag, preserving its dignity even in death. A martyr, Tirupur Kumaran is remembered in Tamil Nadu by the epithet ' Kodi Katha Kumaran' - The Kumaran who saved the flag. We have to salute this brave soldier who lost his life for our freedom.

You all know about Kittur Rani Chennamma, but what about Matangi Hazra? The forgotten freedom fighter. During the early stages of the Indian independence movement, Matangi Hazra was a well-known leader and activist. Hazra was also referred to as "Gandhi Buri" which denotes herself as an old woman and female version of Gandhi. Her participation encouraged many women to participate in the freedom movement. Hazra also participated in the Salt Satyagraha movement where she was arrested for breaking the Salt Act of 1932. She was instrumental in the creation of the 'All India Women's Conference'. Matangi Hazra became the first Indian woman to be arrested by the British government. She was fearless and determined. At the age of 72, she leads a group of people during the Quit India movement with our national flag high. Even though she was shot numerous times she kept on marching forward chanting "Vande Mataram". She died with the national flag held high and still flying.

There are many such fighters such as Kanakalatha Baruo, Mool mati Bismil Begum, Hazrat Mahal, Lakshmi Sehgal, Bhikaji Cama, Ashalata Sen, Tara Rani Srivastava, Kamla Devi Chattopadhyay and still many more. Our respect for our national flag and national anthem is demonstrated when we stand while it is being played or sung. Soldiers are dying on borders just to protect the national flag and the people of the nation. So at least don't you think we should stand in respect of it, for those who gave their life? Though these unsung heroes and heroines a lost in the books of history, we should remember them for their bravery and sacrifice.

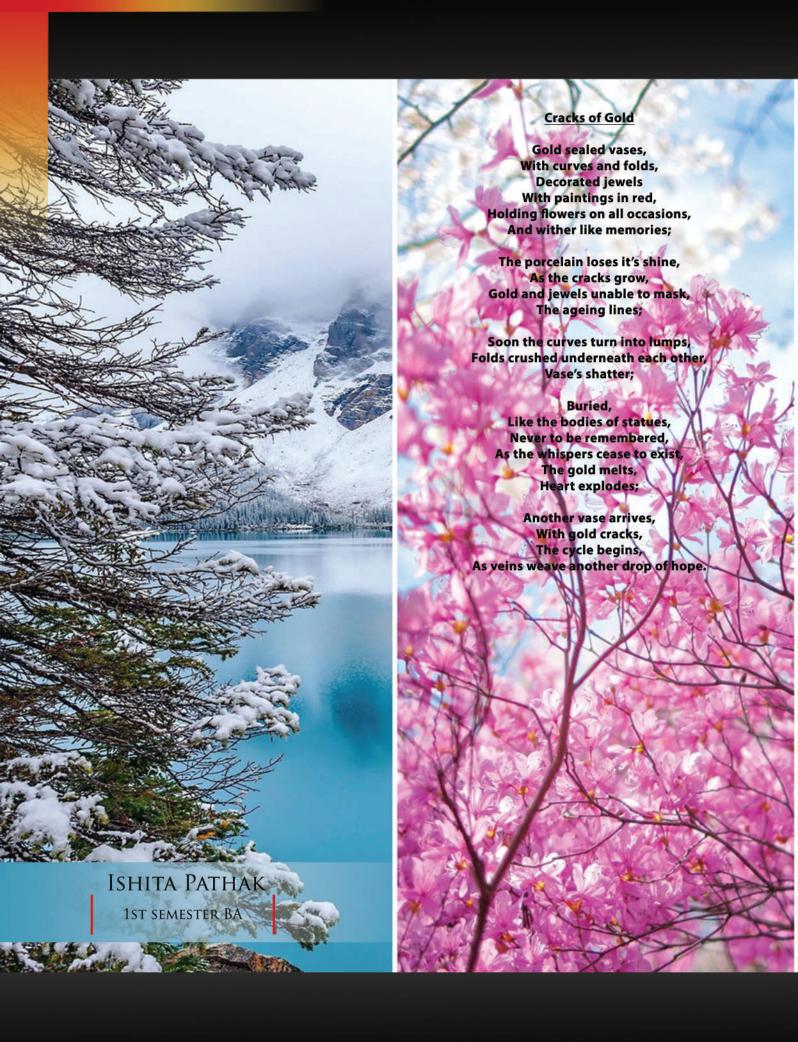












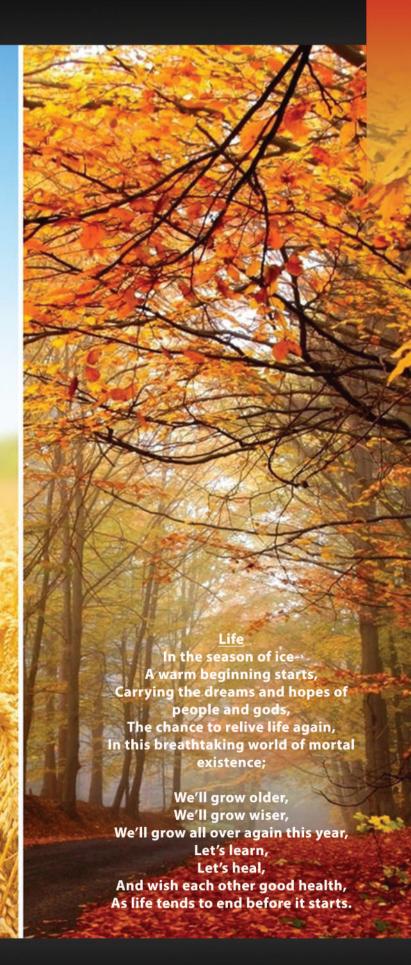
#### Summers Sunshine & Winters call

The glory of eternal winter, The lustre of transient summer, Just like a weeping willow, Under the sun.









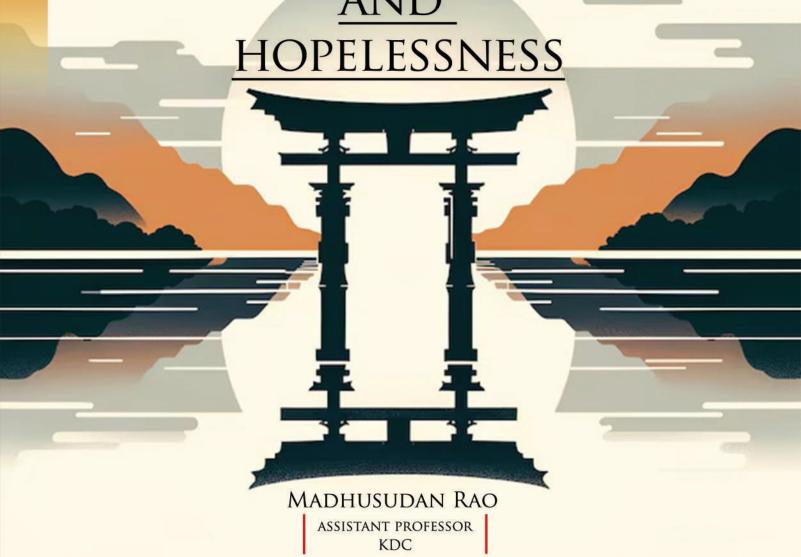








## **EXCHANGE PROGRAMS** AN AMALGAMATION OF HOPE



eally? Exclaimed my Amma, when I brought her the news that I got selected to go to Japan on JENESYS (Japan East Asia Network of Exchange for Students and Youths) sponsored by the Japanese Embassy and AFS India. It all began in 2011 with a detailed application and a medical report submitted to the coordinating Organisation AFS Intercultural Programs, India followed by six rounds of language tests, Essays, interviews, and a home visit. As I moved from one round to the other, I had a sense of Hope and hopeless despair surround me all the time. For someone who excelled in academics yet got bullied in school for not being into sports, the notion of an exchange program was something not only exciting but liberating. This shy boy who was not nominated to be the captain of a House in his school for not having a 'masculine' voice according to some of his ignorant teachers was suddenly flying to Tokyo and experiencing the chilling winds of winter Japan in December 2011.

The city of Tokyo welcomed me and all the other exchange students from various countries for a three-day orientation followed by a host family stay in Okayama. I went to a school called Konko Junior and Senior Secondary School only to be fascinated by the meticulousness and civic behaviour of Japanese students and people in general, their mania for bowing, their hospitality and their strong patriarchal system astonished me like never before. As a sixteen-year-old, processing the new cultural setting was not only exciting but equally challenging. I guess, this is what exchange programs do, they throw you into a new lifestyle and demand a quick adaptation. This journey made me learn several aspects of life and how culture is beyond just ways of living.

To understand a culture, one might read literature, or visit a place but living in a different cultural setting at the impressionable age of sixteen is what makes my journey unique. It was not about eating sushi, it was not about using chopsticks, it was not about sightseeing, it was all about understanding the culture's hidden part, the iceberg below the water. What I mean is, that no culture can be understood from the tip of the iceberg. For instance, imagine a floating iceberg, all you can see is the tip of it but you must know that the larger part of the Iceberg is hidden below. If you now think of an Iceberg as a particular culture, all you can see at the tip is maybe food, clothing, cinema, art, popular culture etc. but a lot of nuanced cultural aspects would still be unexplored unless you try to go under the water to see the hidden part of the Iceberg. For instance, a lot of my Japanese classmates used to say, the Taj Mahal, Aishwarya Rai, Cricket etc. when I told them that I was from India. That is all they knew about India, and similarly for me, all I knew then was only chopsticks, noodles, kimonos, Tea ceremonies, Buddha temples etc. of Japan, but these are only the tip of the Iceberg. What about the hidden part? For instance, how do you tell a Japanese, why are Indians so inquisitive, about our religious diversity, our linguistic diversity? I remember trying to tell all of them in one of my presentations about how we Indians are so loud but that is not even considered rude and how we nod our heads for both Yes and No making it difficult for a foreigner to understand if we agreed or disagreed for something. To understand any culture, it becomes important to live in it for a considerable amount of time and what can be better for it than an Exchange program? This concept of looking at culture from both an insider and outsider's perspective impacted my personality to a large extent making me a culture enthusiast.

Apart from trying to understand cultures, I also had to deal with a lot of Stereotypes and Generalisations. It was so funny to know that a lot of my classmates in Japan thought that we all Indians go to Schools on Elephants! I had not stopped laughing. They also thought all the marriages in India were arranged, we draw water from the well and have a bath and every street has a snake charmer and many more such stereotypes and generalisations came my way some of which I used to make sure to clarify then and there. However, I must say Japanese people, being fellow Asians do have a good sense of Indian Culture, they knew about our Festivities and, some of them loved Rajanikanth and his movies.

What stood out for me was the education system in Japan. I was astonished to see that one has to even clear music, painting and dance period activities to be promoted to the next class. Nothing is neglected. The students are encouraged to clean their respective classrooms and keep the campus clean. I was asked to give several presentations, sing and talk in general about India which enhanced my exchange experience and changed me as a person. My host family consisted of Hisako, Hiroshi and their children. Their warmth and affection were unconditional and lasted even to this day.

I came back from Japan and thought this life-changing opportunity must be available to all those talented ones and I started volunteering with AFS Intercultural Programs, India and went on to become the President of Bangalore chapter. And soon I became a qualified ICL (Intercultural) Trainer and later a GCC (Global Competence Certificate) Facilitator, GCC is a program on 21st C skills offered by AFS and the University of Pennsylvania, USA.

In 2013, I had the opportunity to participate in a Volunteer Exchange Program in the Philippines, I was hosted in Dapitan and awarded the certificate of completion in Metro Manila. The European Federation for Intercultural Learning (EFIL) conducted its Annual Peace Camp in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia in 2019 and had me as their Lead Trainer on Peace Education along with other co-trainers from different parts of the world. In 2022, the US Department of State organised its first ever exchange Program ALEX short-term (American Leadership Experience) and I was lucky to be selected as the Cohort trainer for students from Ghana and Indonesia in Washington DC. The program consisted of several Civic Education Workshops followed by a host family stay. I was hosted in Manteca, California. All these exposures to different cultural settings cultivated 21st-century skills like Communication, Collaboration, Creativity and Critical thinking ability in me. These exchange programs made me empathetic, culturally sensitive, woke and more than anything a social scientist apart from being a Global citizen. Today, I can happily say I've families in Japan, the Philippines and the US which is the beauty of exchange programs as they diminish our differences and show how similar we are as human beings.

If at all the world needs anything today, it is PEACE. What better than exchange programs for youths to understand each other's cultures and break boundaries? I leave you all with this piece of advice, look for some opportunity of an exchange program. Look for international opportunities. There are several organisations including AFS, Red Cross, EISSEC, FLEX, YES many more. Follow them on social media and see what the world has to offer!

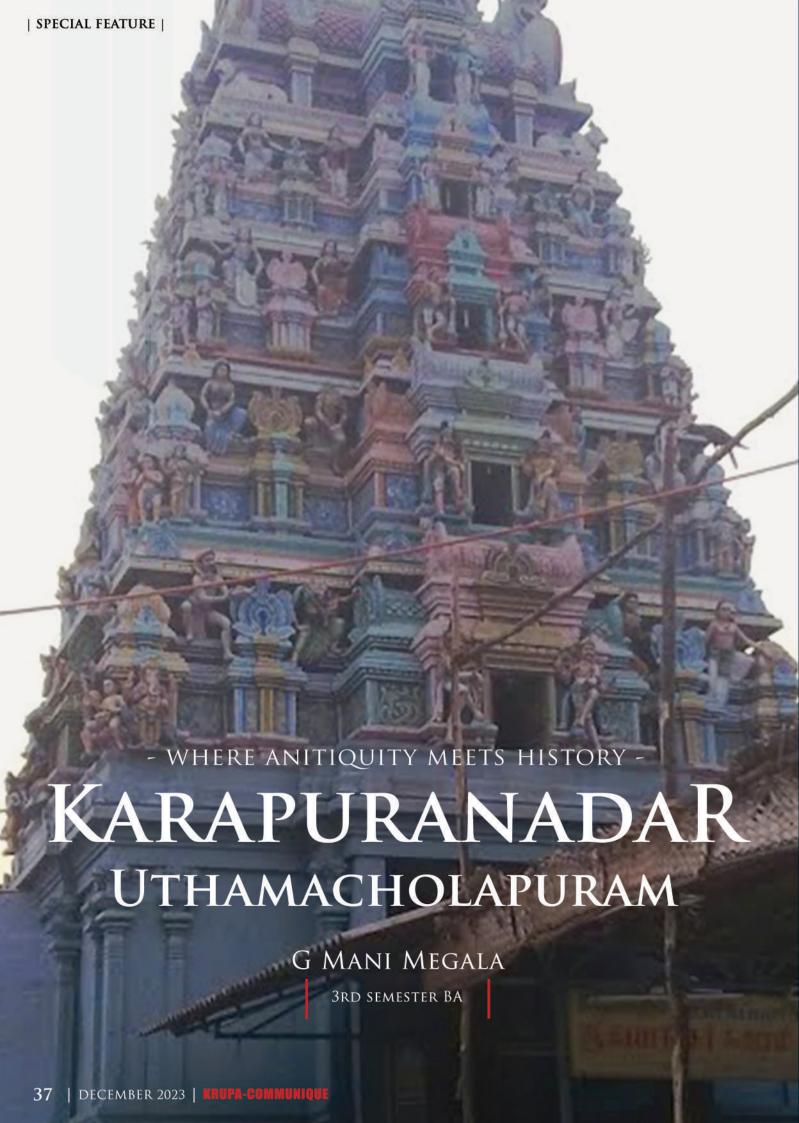












Lord Shiva, and it truly captivated me with its serene atmosphere and rich history.

My trip to Karapuranathar Temple was remarkable and left a deep impression on me. I had read about its historical importance and the beauty and tranquillity of the temple, which made me eager to experience it firsthand. Located in a quiet

recently visited an ancient temple dedicated to

me eager to experience it firsthand. Located in a quiet village near Salem, I could feel a sense of calm as I approached.

The first sight that greeted me was the towering gopuram, intricately carved and adorned with detailed sculptures of gods, animals, and mythological figures. I spent several minutes admiring the carvings, each seemed to narrate stories from a distant past. It's remarkable that this temple is over 1,200 years old, making it one of the oldest temples in the world.

As I walked through the entrance, I noticed a statue of Avvai Patti, a renowned Tamil poet from the 12th century during the Chola dynasty. I learned that this temple uniquely houses her statue at the main entrance, making it the only one in the world with such a feature. Visitors are said to offer their prayers to Avvai Patti before entering the temple.

Inside, the temple was a haven of tranquillity. With only a few visitors around, I had the opportunity to savor the peacefulness. The pillar sculptures depicting various kings and devotees of Lord Shiva were truly mesmerizing. One story shared by the priests particularly resonated with me. It involved three kings: Chola, Chera, and Pandya. There was a king named Pari Vallal who wished for his daughters to marry, but conflicts arose between him and the other kings, making it difficult for suitable matches to be found. His daughters, Sangavi and Angavi, faced a grim future until Avvai Patti intervened. She called the three kings to the temple and proposed a test: if a dead tree near the Ganesh idol blossomed with new

leaves, they would agree to the marriages. Through her prayers and songs to Lord Shiva, the leaves miraculously began to sprout, leading the kings to agree to the unions and bless the daughters. Listening to this story sparked my curiosity about the temple's history.

The locals were warm and welcoming; one elderly man shared additional tales, stating that many believe their prayers in this sacred space can dispel fears and bring peace.

He also described how the locations where the three kings stayed became associated with their names: the Chola king's place is known as Uthamacholapuram, the Pandya king's as Verrapandi, and the Chera king's as Sevarayan, which later evolved into Salem.

As I admired the intricate pillar sculptures, I became intrigued about the tilted head of Lord Shiva.

I approached the elderly man to inquire, and he explained that a boy named Gunasekaran had devoted himself to worshipping Shiva. He wished to place a garland on the deity but couldn't reach high enough. With tears in his eyes, he prayed fervently, and out of compassion, Lord Shiva tilted his head so the boy could adorn him with the garland. This story filled me with joy and further heightened my sense of peace within the temple.

The best time to visit is early in the morning, just as the sun begins to rise, casting a warm, golden glow over the temple. During the annual Maha Shivaratri festival, the temple buzzes with thousands of devotees, creating a vibrant and communal atmosphere.

When I finally departed from Karapuranathar Temple, I felt a profound sense of calm and happiness, carrying that inner peace with me. It was truly a special visit that I will cherish for a long time.
